- This auction sale is held under the auspices of, and conducted by the Early American Coppers Club (Early American Coppers, Inc.), a not-for-profit corporation.
- No charge or commission will be made for executing your bids, but postage or shipping, plus insurance will be added to your invoice.
- 3. Errors in the catalogue will be corrected, but all claims for adjustment must be made in writing within 5 days after receipt of goods. However, we cannot assume responsibility for or correct any errors as to amounts or lot numbers on bid sheets. PLEASE RECHECK YOUR BID SHEET BEFORE MAILING.
- 4. The highest bidder shall be the buyer; should any dispute arise between two or more bidders, the lot in question shall be put up again. If tie bids are received in the mail, the first bid received shall be the one entered. In any event, the auctioneer's decision will be final.
- Mail bids shou d be the maximum price you are willing to pay for each lot. You will pay only the proper advance over the next highest hidder.
- 6. We cannot accept unlimited bids or bids from minors.
- Lots delivered in the State of Virginia will be subject to the 4% Sales Tax.

- 115. 1798 S.149 R.6- Ex Ruby "overall can be considered only fair, as this natural brown cent has crisscross scratches all over the obverse and in the center portions of the reverse there are also three obverse dents very rar and lacking in many cent collections over the years Ex Empire Coin Co., Inc."
- 116. 1798 S.155 R.3 popular "type" coin AG3 dark porous.
