## TERMS OF SALE

1. This auction sale is held under the auspices of, and conducted by the Early American Coppers Club (Early American Coppers, Inc.), a not-for-profit corporation.
2. No charge or commission will be made for executing your bids, but postage or shipping, plus insurance will be added to your invoice.
3. Errors in the catalogue will be corrected, but all claims for adjustment must be made in writing within 5 days after receipt of goods. However, we cannot assume responsibility for or correct any errors as to amounts or lot numbers on bid sheets. PLEASE RECHECK YOUR BID SHEET BEFORE MAILING.
4. The highest bidder shall be the buyer; should any dispute arise between two or more bidders, the lot in question shall be put up again. If tie bids are received in the mail, the first bid received shall be the one entered. In any event, the auctioneer's decision will be final.
5. Mail bids should be the maximum price you are willing to pay for each lot. You will pay only the proper advance over the next highest bidder.
6. We cannot accept unlimited bids or bids from minors.
7. Lots delivered in the State of Texas will be subject to the 5% Sales Tax.
8. Auction sales are strictly for cash, and must be paid for in U.S. Funds. Mail bidders unknown to us must include a deposit of 25% of their bids or their bids will not be accepted. Payment in full is required before delivery of merchandise. Title remains with Early American Coppers, Inc. until all goods are paid for in full.
9. Any lots purchased by floor bidders may not be returned. No lots purchased by mail bidders may be returned without written permission. This is not an approval sale. No lots removed from the original holders may be returned for any reason.
10. If only one mail bid is received on an unreserved lot, the bidding shall start at the bidding level nearest but not greater than 30 % of that mail bid. (See item 11. below)

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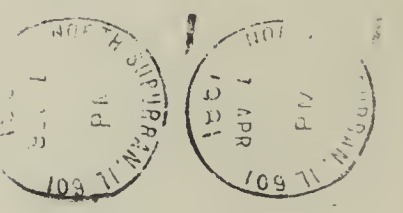
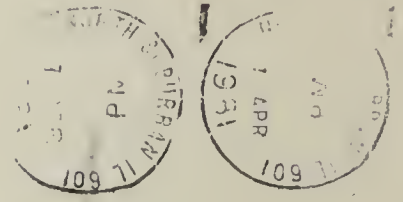
