1. This Sale is conducted by and for the benefit of Early American Coppers, Inc., a not-for-profit organization, (EAC) and its members. The net proceeds of this Sale are utilized to further EAC's primary activities, which are to promote, encourage and sustain a continued interest in early American copper coins and to disseminate relevant information concerning these coins.

2. THIS IS A PRIVATE SALE OPEN ONLY TO MEMBERS OF EAC.

- 3. Each lot will be sold to the highest bidder. Should identical bids be received on any lot, the first bid received by EAC shall be given preference. Should any dispute arise between bidders on a particular lot, EAC shall decide the same.
- 4. There is NO BUYER'S COMMISSION OR FEE.
- 5. Bidding shall be by mail or in person. Mail bids should be made for the maximum amount you are willing to pay for the applicable lot. Your bid will be reduced as appropriate that it is only the proper advance over the next highest bid. Mail bids should be made only on the Bid Sheet contained in this catalogue, and should be sent to the address(es) designated thereon. EAC cannot and does not assume any responsibility for or to correct any errors whatever on Bid Sheets. PLEASE RECHECK YOUR BID SHEET CAREFULLY BEFORE MAILING. No deposit is required of mail or floor bidders, however, all bidders are required to honor their bids. EAC will execute mail bids on behalf of its members, without charge or commission; however see Item 7 below.
- 6. Each lot shall be opened for bidding at the reserved amount set forth in this catalogue, or as determined by EAC. No mail bid of less than \$25.00 on any U.S. coin lot will be accepted. Bidding shall increase in whole or round dollar amounts, at the discretion of EAC. Bids made in other than whole or round dollar amounts will be reduced to nearest such amount.
- 7. Lots delivered in any locality where this Sale is conducted may be subject to state and/or local sales tax. Any such tax may be invoiced separately after delivery of purchases. Postage or shipping, plus insurance, will be added to the invoice of purchasers who have their purchases shipped.
- 8. This Sale is strictly for cash; payment in full for all purchases must be made in current U.S. funds, upon receipt of invoice or prior to delivery of purchases. Personal checks with current funds available are acceptable; no credit cards or credit arrangements are acceptable. Title remains with EAC or its consignors until purchases are paid in full.
- 9. Lots designated "as is" are sold on a strictly "AS IS" basis. No returns whatever. All multiple coin lots are sold on a strictly "AS IS" basis.

Couple points sharper with some dull rim nicks around the obverse. Dark olive brown with tan highpoints. Sharp EDS, a scarce die state. Average. 1827 N-6 R3 VG10. Sharpness VF20 but lightly corroded. No marks. Dark olive and steel brown. MDS. Scudzy. 1827 N-9 R3 G6. Sharpness VG8 with a few minor marks and some micro roughness. MDS. Average-. 1831 N-12 R1 G4. Sharpness VG7 with some digs inside the wreath. Recolored glossy steel brown. Later die state with a 2-point cud break at star 13, Newcomb's state 12/1. Average-. 1831 N-14 R4- G5. Slightly sharper with a few marks over star 1. Otherwise nice. Glossy chocolate brown. LDS. Average. Lot of 6 coins.
- **720.** Group of Five Middle Date Cents. 1818 N-5 R3 F12. Sharpness near VF30 with a rim dent at star 1, some roughness on the chin, and a few hairline scratches across the reverse. Recolored glossy steel brown and chocolate. MDS. Scudzy. 1820/19 N-1 R1 VG8. Glossy chocolate brown with medium brown highpoints. A few tiny nicks, none notable. EDS, the overdate sharp. Average. 1820 N-5 R3 VG10. Sharpness VF20 with some nicks and the planchet is slightly rough. Dark steel, the highpoints lighter. EDS. Average-. 1822 N-2 R3 VG10. Five points sharper but the planchet is slightly granular. No marks. Dark steel with lighter brown highpoints. MDS. Average-. 1826 N-3 R3 G6. Sharpness VF20 but moderately corroded. No marks. Dark steel. EDS. Scudzy. Lot of 5 coins.
- **721.** 1819 N-9 R1 VF25. Slightly sharper but nicely recolored glossy light brown. There are a few minor ticks on both sides, none notable. Sharp EDS. Average.
- **722.** 1821 N-2 R1 VG10. Sharpness VF25 with dull, slightly rough surfaces. Dark chocolate brown and steel. Sharp details and no marks. MDS. Scudzy.
- **723.** 1822 N-6 R3 VG7. Sharpness F12 with a few tiny pits on the right side of the obverse and several minor rim nicks on both sides. Glossy dark olive, the highpoints lighter. Average.
- **724.** 1822 N-12 R4 VG8. Sharpness F12 with some microscopic roughness in the obverse fields. No notable marks. Glossy steel and chocolate, probably recolored. Average-.
- **725.** 1823/2 N-1 R2 VG7. Several points sharper with a small but rather deep punch mark right of the F in OF. Otherwise just a few minor nicks consistent with the grade. Glossy medium brown. MDS, the overdate clear. Average or slightly below.
- **726.** 1823/2 N-1 R2 G6. Slightly sharper but recolored glossy steel brown and chocolate with some lighter highpoints. No significant marks. MDS, the overdate clear. Average.
- 727. 1823/2 N-1 R2 G6. Counterstamped with an incuse 7-pointed star in the center of the obverse. The star is about 5mm wide and in its center is a round lump. Sharpness of the host coin is VG10 or so but there are a few patches of very light roughness. Recolored dark steel brown with faded artificial red in protected areas. The counterstamp is deeply and evenly impressed. E-MDS, the overdate sharp. Average to a counterstamp collector, scudzy to a cent collector. Reserve \$110.
- **728.** 1823 N-2 R2 VG7. Slightly sharper with a dull, light rim nick under the bust tip. The obverse is nicely recolored glossy steel and chocolate with hints of very faded red in protected areas. The reverse is a natural glossy chocolate brown with medium brown highpoints. MDS. Average.
- **729.** 1825 N-10 R3+ G6. A couple points sharper with microscopic roughness in the fields and a hairline scratch inside the wreath. Very dark olive with lighter steel brown highpoints. LDS with a cud break joining star 7 to the rim above. Average.

- **730.** 1828 N-1 R1 VF20. Slightly sharper but nicely recolored glossy light brown and tan. LDS. Average.
- **731.** 1828 N-5 R3+ AG3. Sharpness VG7 but lightly corroded with a rim bruise at star 10. Cleaned, now retoning steel brown and olive. Rare LDS with a cud break joining ED in UNITED to the rim. Scudzy (but this die state is seldom found better).
- **732.** 1828 N-11 R2 F12. A few points sharper with some minor roughness on the rim at D-S, possibly as struck, plus a very light rim bruise at star 7. Nice glossy chocolate brown. MDS. Average.
- **733.** 1828 N-11 R1 F15. Glossy medium brown and light olive brown. No problems. LDS. Average, possibly a bit better.
- **734.** 1829 N-5 R3+ VG8+. Small Letters Reverse. Glossy steel brown with lighter brown and tan in the protected areas. The planchet is nice and smooth and the only mark is a small dig under the eye. EDS. Average+.
- **735.** 1829 N-5 R3+ VG7. Attractive glossy chocolate brown with medium brown highpoints. Virtually free of marks. LDS. Choice.
- 736. 1830 N-2 R2+ VG8. Glossy medium brown. No problems. MDS. Average+.
- **737.** 1830 N-3 R3 VG7. Slightly sharper with a fine scratch outlining the profile. Glossy chocolate brown and olive. LDS. Average.
- **738.** 1830 N-5 R3 F12. Slightly sharper with a patch of microscopic roughness under star 5 and a few tiny rim nicks at the bottom of the reverse. Glossy medium brown with splashes of darker olive brown on the obverse. LDS. Average.
- **739.** 1831 N-5 R4 G6. Glossy light to medium brown. No marks, but the bottom of the obverse is a bit weakly struck. Average.
- **740.** 1831 N-12/1 R1 VG8+. Glossy dark chocolate brown and steel. Just a few minor nicks consistent with the grade. M-LDS with a 2-point cud break joining star 13 to the rim below. Average.
- **741.** Trio of Middle Date Cents. 1831 N-10 R3 F12. Sharpness VF30 but slightly rough. Dark olive brown, the highpoints lighter steel brown. MDS. Scudzy. 1838 N-2 R1 VG10. Several points sharper but recolored glossy steel brown. MDS. Average. 1839 N-2 R2 F15. Head of 1838. Five points sharper but recolored glossy olive brown with light brown highpoints. No notable marks. E-MDS. Average. Lot of 3 coins.
- **742.** 1834 N-1 R1 G4. Struck at least 10% off center to K-7 so nearly all the date is off the planchet. Glossy medium brown and chocolate with some darker olive on the reverse. The only notable mark is a rim nick at F in OF. Average.
- **743.** 1834 N-6 R3 F12. Double Profile. A few points sharper but recolored fairly glossy light steel brown mottled with some chocolate. No marks or roughness. MDS. There is strike doubling on the forehead, lips, and chin. Average.
- **744.** 1835 N-1 R1 VG8. Large Date. Glossy chocolate brown with medium brown highpoints. A few minor ticks consistent with the grade. MDS. Average.

- 745. 1835 N-14 R2 VF20. Head of 1836. Glossy light brown. The only mark is a dull nick in the field before the forehead. Sharp EDS. Average+.
- **746.** 1836 N-6 R2 ANACS graded VF30 with the N-6 attribution noted on the slab label. EAC graded F15, possibly a bit better but less than VF20. Nice medium brown. MDS. Average.
- 747. 1838 N-9 R3 VF20. At least five points sharper with too many tiny nicks for the higher grade. Glossy chocolate brown with medium brown highpoints. LDS with a strong rim cud extending from star 13 to under the 1 in the date. A rare die state and the cud is quite bold on this example. Average. Ex M&G Auction 10/2/93:194.
- **748.** 1839 N-9 R2 VG8. Silly Head. Glossy chocolate brown. No problems. MDS. Average.
- **749.** Group of Five Late Date Cents. 1840 N-8 R1 VG10. Glossy medium brown. No defects. LDS. Average. 1844 N-1 R1 F15+. A bit sharper with a few minor ticks on the obverse. Glossy medium brown. LDS. Average. 1844 N-7 R2+ F15. Five points sharper with some tiny ticks on the obverse. Nice glossy medium brown. MDS. Average. 1845 N-3 R4 VF25. Sharpness EF40 with a dozen or so small rim nicks on both sides plus a dull nick at the chin. Glossy medium brown with darker steel highpoints. Sharp EDS with prooflike fields. Average-. 1856 N-17 R2 VF20. Sharpness VF30 but recolored tan with darker brown highpoints and a rim bump at star 8. MDS. Average. Lot of 5 coins.
- **750.** 1842 N-1 R2 VG8. Glossy medium brown. A few minor marks, none notable. MDS. Average.
- **751.** 1843 N-11 R2- VF30. At least 5 points sharper with a hairline scratch under star 11 and a few tiny rim nicks at F-A, plus a small rim bruise at the second T in STATES. Nice glossy medium brown. E-MDS. Average. Ex Bowers & Merena 9/11/95:3397.
- **752.** 1843 N-12 R2 VF20. Sharpness EF40 with three obvious rim nicks on the obverse, a few lighter ones on the reverse, and a dull rim bruise at E in UNITED. Nice glossy light brown and tan with darker steel brown toning on the highpoints. Sharp EDS, the fields hard and slightly reflective. Average-.
- **753.** 1844/81 N-2 R2 F15. Five points sharper with some minor nicks on the obverse and a small stain of darker toning at OF. Glossy medium brown. MDS, the blundered date clear. Average.
- **754.** 1845 N-4 R1 EF45. Glossy dark chocolate brown with mint frost in protected areas. The only mark is a tiny carbon spot over star 1. Sharp E-MDS. Average. Ex 1997 EAC Sale, lot 321.
- **755.** 1845 N-10 R3- EF40. Choice glossy chocolate brown. A few tiny ticks on the face and neck are the only marks, and they are trivial. MDS. Average or a bit better.
- **756.** 1846 N-4 R1 VF20+. Ten points sharper with some nicks on both sides, including a dull rim nick at star 11. EDS, the repunched date sharp. Average.
- **757.** 1846 N-11 R1 VF25. Medium date. Ten points sharper with some nicks on the obverse, especially on the cheek and star 11. Nice glossy medium brown. E-MDS. Average.
- **758.** 1846 N-12 R1 F15. Tall Date. Slightly sharper with tiny ticks on the obverse, mostly at the throat. Glossy medium brown. MDS. Average.

- **759.** 1849 N-29 R2 VF25. Five points sharper with a minor rim bruise at star 9 and a flake out of the planchet, as minted, at the dentils off the ribbon end. Glossy dark chocolate brown with light brown highpoints E-MDS. Average.
- **760.** 1850 N-9 R2 VG8. Slightly sharper with a few minor marks. Glossy medium brown. LDS. Average.
- **761.** 1850 N-14 R4 VF20. Five points sharper with a fresh scuff over star 11. Otherwise a nice glossy medium brown. Very scarce EDS with all the fine die lines clear. Average.
- **762.** 1850 N-14 R4 VF25. At least five points sharper but recolored glossy steel brown and there is a fine hairline scratch in the field up from the bust tip. MDS. Average.
- **763.** 1852 N-3 R1 VF35. A little sharper with a pair of very light scratches on the cheek. Otherwise choice. Glossy medium brown with underlying mint frost. LDS. Average.
- **764.** 1852 N-4 R1 VF30. Choice glossy medium brown. MDS. Very nice. Average+, nearly choice.
- **765.** 1852 N-6 R2- VF20. Ten points sharper but dark with a few traces of very light verdigris on both sides. Glossy very dark olive brown. LDS with a strong rim cud at stars 10-12. Average-.
- **766.** 1853 N-6 R1 VF30. Glossy light brown. No marks, but it could use a bath. MDS. Average+.
- **767.** 1853 N-16 R1+ VF30. Glossy medium brown. A tiny tick on the cheek and another over star 9. M-LDS. Average+.
- **768.** Pair of Late Date Cents. 1855 N-9 R1 VF25. Slightly sharper with a few minor nicks and a small rim bruise at TA in STATES. Glossy light brown. M-LDS, the knob break over the ear well developed. Average. 1857 N-1 R1 AG3. Sharpness VG7 with many marks. Date and legends still clear. Medium brown. Scudzy. Lot of 2 coins.
- **769.** 1857 N-1 R1 VF25. Large Date. Sharpness near EF40 but recolored glossy medium brown and olive. There are some nicks at the throat and dark olive stains on the reverse. E-MDS. Average-.
- **770.** 1857 N-1 R1 VF20. Large Date. Nice glossy light to medium brown. The only mark is a minor rim bruise at star 9. MDS. Average.
- **771.** 1857 N-1 R1 VG10+. Large Date. Five points sharper with a dull, light scratch under star 11 and a few tiny rim nicks on both sides. Glossy medium brown. LDS. Average-.
- 772. Encased 1847 N-12 cent advertising William A. Muller & Co., an insurance business established in 1847. The cent is F12 but cleaned bright; the casing is AU50. (Denis Loring can fill you in on the history of this advertising piece. My memory is that it was issued in 1947 to help celebrate their centennial anniversary.)
- **773.** 1837 Feuchtwanger Cent Hard Times Token Low-120 Die combination 6-I. Nice EF40. A few faint scratches over the eagle's head are the only marks. Bright silvery gray toning. Average.

774. Trio of Hard Times issues. 1833 Low-76 Robinson's Jones & Co. VG10. Struck 5-10% off center to K-9. Glossy chocolate brown. 1841 Low-59 Webster Political EF45 but cleaned with a couple rim nicks, net VF30. 1840 Martin Van Buren political medal with Whigs and Democrats on a balance scale. Sharpness EF40 but a bit rough with some crud and a few marks. Pierced at the top for wear with a ribbon. Not part of the HTT series; rather considered a political badge/medal. Lot of 3 pieces.
